

# NFH Goals

- 1. Advocate for a cabin program that is viable in perpetuity.**
  - A. Ensure that recreation residence interests are alert to and represented in government decisions and considerations affecting recreation residences.
  - B. Provide information and assistance to permit holders who are threatened by termination, environmental restrictions, or economic issues.
  - C. Identify and develop strategic alliances that further the goals of NFH.
  - D. Promote, document and communicate the stewardship activities of the cabin community.
  - E. Support private ownership efforts by cabin tract organizations.
  - F. Foster a working relationship with the U.S. Forest Service based on shared recreation interests and frequent, open, and direct dialog.
  
- 2. Broaden and increase membership, participation and representation in NFH.**
  - A. Increase NFH membership among recreation residence permit holders, family and friends.
  - B. Improve Member Tract assistance, recognition and role in NFH.
  - C. Increase member participation in NFH committees and meetings.
  - D. Explore the feasibility of participation by other cabin programs in NFH.
  
- 3. Provide NFH with a sound financial base.**
  - A. Develop, adopt and monitor annual budgets of revenues and expenditures.
  - B. Maintain financial records, procedures and reports to provide accurate, timely and complete documentation of NFH finances.
  - C. Explore other sources of funding support for NFH.
  - D. Maintain adequate financial reserves to meet unanticipated challenges.
  
- 4. Improve communications between NFH, its members, cabin users, tract organizations, government agencies and the interested public.**
  - A. Improve the information processes and capabilities of NFH through current technologies.
  - B. Establish NFH as the clearinghouse for information on cabin-related issues.
  
- 5. Educate and inform members and the interested public about issues and policies affecting the Recreation Residence Program.**
  - A. Establish NFH as an environmentally-aware organization by participating in and sponsoring policy development and activities at local, regional and national levels.
  - B. Continue a strong emphasis on environment issues in Forum and Annual Convention programs.
  - C. Identify and make available information regarding issues, current and proposed legislation and programs affecting recreation residences.
